
Basic Boating Education

America's Boating Course (Introduction to Boating Skills and Safety) Taught by trained "America's Boating Club" Instructors



Presented by Cape Lookout Sail & Power Squadron, America's Boating Club

This basic boating course provides students with the fundamentals of boating and the opportunity to earn the NC Boater Education Certificate, a requirement for boat operators born after January 1, 1988. This is New Bern's only introductory boating course with on-the-water training. The class is approved by the State of North Carolina and recognized by the US Coast Guard.



November 2, 2019 - Second Saturday classroom session (8am-5pm) covers:

- Review previous week's material and take the NC Boater Education Exam
- Go into greater detail on using nautical charts
- Learn how to plot and follow a safe course on the water
 - Learn how to use GPS and chart plotters to navigate

November 3, 2019 - Sunday on-the -water session covers:

Student groups will have practical experience with instructors in a boat on the water.

Vessel Safety Check program



We are nearing the end of the VSE year to submit inspections our Vessel Safety Examiners have done for the squadron. We have had a very good year number wise, but we have more work to do. It seems that the Wilmington Squadron has been the squadron with the most inspections in our district until last year, which of course out squadron replaced them. I never really thought about inter squadron competition, but I guess that has been there all along, we just weren't in the mix until last year. Well, Wilmington apparently has committed themselves to re-take that position. Thus far, we are 14 inspections ahead of last year, which in itself is great. To put last year's accomplishment in perspective, we have only 7 active examiners. Wilmington has 25.

I think it would be terrific if Cape Lookout Sail and Power Squadron repeats as top VSE Squadron in the district again this year. To do so, we need your help. Even if you know your vessel would not pass a VSE, it is important to have one done anyway. The examiner may very well find something else you need to do to have a safe vessel other than what you may already know. An important note for those of you who decide not to have an examination because you know your vessel would not pass. The identification of the owner or the vessel data for an inspection does not go anywhere beyond our squadron. However, a vessel that does not pass still counts as an inspection for the examiner and the squadron. In other words, each inspection counts for the squadron regardless of whether or not the vessel passes.

So, again, you can help your squadron extend last year's first place performance by having your vessel inspected. Remember, ALL vessels can be inspected; i.e. sail, power, canoe, dinghy, paddle board, kayak, etc. if it floats and can carry a person, it counts. Owen Smith, VSE Chair
