Here's a review of the USCG requirements for fire extinguishers for recreational vessels. Instead of the B-1, B-2, B-3 extinguishers, the new nomenclature is 5-B portable fire extinguisher. What this means is the fire extinguisher is rated for all three types of fires and will cover 5 cubic feet. If your vessel is large enough to require two or 3 extinguishers, a 20-B extinguisher can take the place of two 5-B extinguishers.

On another point, the USCG will soon allow us to continue to do Voluntary Vessel Examinations. At this writing I do not have the specific date, but I would presume that "soon" means sometime in July. When the official notification comes, I will make sure the squadron membership is so notified.

In our morning news, the weatherman has been searching for the beginnings of any hurricane in the eastern Atlantic. He commented about how much dust was in the air, and how some of the dust was coming all the way across the Atlantic Ocean. In some of his graphics he showed the west coast of Africa, and a group of islands west of the African coast. The 10 islands are Cape Verde which are about 400 miles west of Dakar, Senegal.

Cape Verde was discovered by the

Portuguese around 1456. Up to then the islands were uninhabited. They became Portuguese "property" until their independence in 1974.

In the 1500's, the slave trade began, and Cape Verde became a convenient place to market slaves. Ships brought the slaves to Cape Verde from Africa, and ships "shopped" for slaves in the relative controlled environment of a Portuguese port. The slave trade declined in the 1800's, and the island's economy declined. The islands were mainly used for re-supply and stopover points for passing ships. In the late 20th century tourism brought some prosperity back to the islands.


In 2017 we sailed on the Star Clippers Cruise Line on Star Flyer. We departed Las Palmas, Grand Canary, and sailed SSW for four days (about 660 NM) to reach Cape Verde at the city of Mindelo on Sao Vicente Island. Someone may have "discovered" the islands before the Portugeuse, but the topography of the islands is not very inviting—volcanic islands with no, to very little arable land, and it doesn't rain much (our cruise was in November and it hadn't rained since July.) It's just mainly rock. Here's a picture of a "farm" and its surroundings.

We took a bus tour of the island and when we reached the east side of the island, facing Africa, we found some lovely beaches. This is the sand in the air that our weatherman was talking about. Through the clear water you can see the sand goes some distance out to sea. All this sand came from Africa, but, sadly, right behind the beaches, it's just plain rock.



There are some very nice hotels and touristy spots, but sadly the remaining part of the islands that I saw was very poor. My advice to you, when you get the chance to go to Cape Verde, give it a miss.
