Even though we are still hampered by the Covid-19 restrictions, the VSE program for Cape Lookout Sail and Power Squadron is off to a good start.



At the writing of this article, we have completed 127 Vessel Safety Checks. Most of those were of paddle craft at MCAS Cherry Point. The balance are of boat owners that have had previous safety checks with one that has never had a safety check before. Our examiners can do safety checks at their discretion which means due to most of us being of the "senior" category, it is up to the individual examiner whether or not to place themselves at possible exposure to the virus.

That being said, if you are ready and willing to have a current vessel safety check done, please contact one of our examiners, or me, and we will try to accommodate you. Remember that even if you know you won't pass a safety check, the examiner and thus the squadron still gets credit for having done a VSE. The information regarding pass/fail does not go any further than me regarding the name of the boat owner, and is never reported to a law enforcement agency. Bottom line, your commitment to the VSE program benefits Cape Lookout Sail and Power Squadron.

I hope all of our members who still have boats have a safe boating season in 2021.
