As I reported in previous issues of the newsletter, last year our Vessel Safety Examiners completed 441 safety checks. Of those, only one was completed for a CLSPS member. According to our current roster, our members have 23 boats, not including dinghys. Why do I bring this up?

At the District Change of Watch, our squadron received a certificate from the Chief Commander recognizing our squadron for having the 4th most VSEs of all squadrons for 2022 in the United States Power Squadron. If we had most of our own squadron included in last year's numbers, we might well have been a bit higher on the recognition list. Maybe?

Having a current VSE isn't really about squadron recognition. The whole

purpose of the VSE program is to help boat owners assure that their boats have the proper safety equipment, current registration, etc. to have a safe boating season. So far this year we have completed 6 vessel safety checks with a lot more coming in the next month or so. Our examiners stand ready to complete a voluntary VSE for any squadron member willing to make a time commitment of 15-20 minutes to have your vessel checked.

Just contact any of our examiners listed in this newsletter and we will make sure your vessel is checked.
